Greetings, grace, and peace from the Ascension's "Grace in Action" Stewardship Team!

One of Jesus' most famous parables is usually called, "The Parable of the Prodigal Son." But this is actually a parable designed to teach us about the merciful, generous nature of God. And to the extent that "prodigal" means extravagant or over-the-top, that word is better applied to the father in the story.

The son comes home hoping for a modest meal in exchange for an apology. Before he can say a word, however, his father is lavishing him with love and making preparations for a party. For the prodigal parent, only a splendid celebration will do.

Jesus says that God - the Prodigal Parent - puts grace into action this way: welcoming us home even when we don't "deserve" it; forgiving us completely before we can even ask; and treating just the sight of us as cause for extravagant joy.

At our best, this sort of celebratory welcome is what Ascension is all about. Welcoming visitors and regulars alike into the beautiful choreography of worship and celebration. We strive to be a community of joy - prodigal, extravagant, and free - for anyone who longs for a meal, an embrace, and the reassurance that they are not alone.

This welcome is about repairing the world through love, one celebration at a time. That's "Grace in Action." You can hear it in the language we use: we celebrate Communion, celebrate Baptism, celebrate Easter, celebrate Christmas, celebrate Youth Sunday, we celebrate all our ministries and we celebrate our community in so many ways.

And speaking of celebration: we're looking forward to celebrating our "Grace in Action" Commitment Sunday with you on November 27, 2022. We will hold a special Coffee Hour that morning to celebrate, you won't want to miss it!

A letter from our visitor from Denmark

Dear Debra,

When I for the second time visited your wonderful church last month I promised you to write you about my impressions from the visits in March and now in October. I had some busy weeks after I came home - but as I tomorrow at our annual "Community-meeting" in our church will mention my visits, it must be the right time to write to you.

Thank you again for the warm welcome - that was a thing I mentioned when I came back from Utah in March - here we have to be better to welcome new people in our church ! But in Denmark we are a bit more reluctant and often have the feeling that some people maybe want to be more anonymous. I myself felt it strange when I moved to Elsinore 43 years ago and twice visited the local church - and nobody welcomed the new guest.

I moved to Elsinore to teach at the local High School - Helsingoer Gymnasium - I taught there for 43 years and only stopped this summer. That's the reason I could visit my Danish friends Susanne and Keld in North Ogden outside the holidays - Keld is sent by the Danish Airforce to Hill Air force base and they will be staying there five months more - they came to North Ogden back in 2021 but because of the corona I could only visit them now in March - and again in October.

The second thing I noticed is of course all the work in and around the church done by volunteers. With a "State Church" like the Danish "Evangelical-Lutheran Church" or "Folkekirken" - see more on <https://www.lutheranchurch.dk/> - it's harder to get people to work for the church. They expect that the church is there - but many Danes will only come for baptism, confirmation, sometimes weddings and then for the funerals. A lot of Danes will also come for Christmas - so I think my Danish friend asked you or another person in your church about the services around Christmas - because here it's very much Christmas Eve that is celebrated. Will you have services also on December 24th ?

"My" church is just south of Elsinore - we have two very old churches in the middle of the town - besides Copenhagen the only Danish town with an English name - the Danish name is Helsingør - with the Danish "ø" - oe. In the seventies and eighties two new churches were built - I belong to "Sthens Kirke" - named after Hans Christensen Sthens (1544-1610) who was a priest here in Elsinore - and wrote some famous psalms. I am the chairman of the Church Board - Menighedsraadet.



I wish you God's blessing for you and your family and the very nice community in Ascension Church.
