#### Welcome to Worship

Call to Worship

P In this second week of our stewardship campaign, I invite you to think about the story of the Prodigal –

It is the story of a family in all its raw truth.

One son believes he is ready to take his early inheritance and to head out into the world.

The other son goes about doing what needs to be done -

quietly harboring resentment in his heart.

The father extravagantly loving, forgiving, and rejoicing.

P As you imagine this setting, where do you locate yourself? Are you sometimes the wandering sibling, lost and longing to go home? Are you the dutiful older sibling – doing all the right things but unable to rejoice when others receive grace? Since we are made in God's divine image, are you able to imagine yourself in the role of the prodigal parent – extravagantly loving, forgiving and rejoicing?

Joy is at the center of this story – divine joy – the joy of one who was lost and has come home. What about the older son reluctant to enter the celebration?

What do you celebrate - or fail to celebrate?

Are there parties you refuse to enter or simply ignore? How can we become people of joy – a congregation of joy – even more than we already are?

When it comes to generosity, can we give for the sake of joy?

Sometimes we hear the story.

Creators, redeemers, sustainers!

From generosity – for generosity.

A Reading from 2 Thessalonians, the 3rd chapter

Some members of the Thessalonian community, because of their belief in the nearness of Christ's return, had ceased to work, living off the generosity of other members of the community. The writer of this letter warns them bluntly that if they want to eat, they need to work.

<sup>6</sup>Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. <sup>7</sup>For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, <sup>8</sup>and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labor we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. <sup>9</sup>This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. <sup>10</sup>For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. <sup>11</sup>For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. <sup>12</sup>Now such persons we command and

exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. <sup>13</sup>Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

<sup>12</sup>"But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. <sup>13</sup>This will give you an opportunity to testify. <sup>14</sup>So make up your minds not to prepare your defense in advance; <sup>15</sup>for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. <sup>16</sup>You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. <sup>17</sup>You will be hated by all because of my name. <sup>18</sup>But not a hair of your head will perish. <sup>19</sup>By your endurance you will gain your souls."
