# A Reading from Isaiah, the 35<sup>th</sup> chapter

The prophet describes the return from the Babylonian captivity as a joyous procession to Zion. God's coming reign will bring a renewal of creation in which health and wholeness will be restored. There is no need for fear, for God is coming to save.

<sup>1</sup>The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad,

the desert shall rejoice and blossom;

like the crocus <sup>2</sup>it shall blossom abundantly,

and rejoice with joy and singing.

The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it,

the majesty of Carmel and Sharon.

They shall see the glory of the LORD,

the majesty of our God.

<sup>3</sup>Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees.

<sup>4</sup>Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God.

He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense.

He will come and save you."

<sup>5</sup>Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened,

and the ears of the deaf unstopped; <sup>6</sup>then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy.

For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; <sup>7</sup>the burning sand shall become a pool,

and the thirsty ground springs of water;

the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp,

the grass shall become reeds and rushes.

<sup>8</sup>A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way;

the unclean shall not travel on it, but it shall be for God's people;

no traveler, not even fools, shall go astray.

<sup>9</sup>No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there.

<sup>10</sup>And the ransomed of the LORD shall return, and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads;

they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away. Isaiah 35:1-10

### All Glory to you, O Lord.

John the Baptist expects the Messiah to bring God's judgment upon the earth (Matt. 3:11-12). From a prison cell, he wonders whether Jesus is the one who will do this. Jesus' response indicates that God's reign is indeed being fulfilled already through healing and restoration.

<sup>2</sup>When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples <sup>3</sup>and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" <sup>4</sup>Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: <sup>5</sup>the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. <sup>6</sup>And

blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me."

<sup>7</sup>As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? <sup>8</sup>What then did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. <sup>9</sup>What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. <sup>10</sup>This is the one about whom it is written,

'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you,

who will prepare your way before you.'

<sup>11</sup>Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." *Matthew 11:2-11*

# **Anointed to Sacred Space**

All things were "Christified"-anointed at their creation.

This week, you are invited to an anointing of your senses to seek a depth of vision that notices the precious details around us.

[If you attended worship here on-site with us last week, you should have been given a small vial of oil at the door. For those of you worshiping with us at home, please take a moment to grab a little olive oil from the kitchen or some lotion from your bathroom cabinet.]

As you rise in the morning, try a ritual of touching your eyes and ears, nose, lips, and hands for a brief moment (with lotion, cream, or chapstick... or without) to ready them to a deeper looking, hearing, smelling, tasting, and touching.

Imagine that this ritual touch imbues your senses with a kind of superpower beyond their usual powers of observation. Imagine that your "noticer" is turned onto a high frequency and that you will experience common and usual spaces at home and work and out in your daily life in a way that brings more joy than you have felt before about those places.

And then one time this week, if possible, share a visit with someone to a place that is special, that is magical to you—perhaps it is a street with houses covered in Christmas lights, or a place in nature that calms and soothes you, or a cozy place by a fire with a cup of tea or coffee.

Soak in the sacred that is reflected all around you.

 P When you see lights twinkle, when you catch a reflection in a mirror, when you notice the sunlight dancing on a surface or a nightlight glowing in the darkness, let these be signs that the Christ Light is revealed again and again in and through this world.

Know that your brilliant presence is pouring more love into a weary world. God loved us by becoming us.

This means you are already reflecting the sacred.
