

A Reading from Isaiah, the 7th chapter


An Israelite and Aramean military coalition presented a serious threat to King Ahaz of Judah. In response, Ahaz decided to secure his throne and kingdom by seeking Assyrian help. Isaiah reminds Ahaz that human attempts to establish security will fail. The prophet gives the sign that is the only source of true safety: Immanuel, God is with us!

¹⁰The LORD spoke to Ahaz, saying, ¹¹Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. ¹²But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test. ¹³Then Isaiah said: "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? ¹⁴Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel. ¹⁵He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. ¹⁶For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted."

Gospel Reading

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 1st chapter.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

Matthew's story of Jesus' birth focuses on the role of Joseph, who adopts the divinely-begotten child into the family of David and obediently gives him the name Jesus, which means "God saves."

¹⁸Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. ²⁰But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²²All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

²³"Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,"

which means, "God is with us." When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, 5 but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.





and he will come to judge the living and the dead.


I believe in the Holy Spirit,







Anointed to Sacred Knowing

All season long, we have been marking sacred time, people, and space with the anointing of oil, lotion, or touch.

[If you attended worship here on-site with us these past few weeks, you should have been given a small vial of oil at the door. For those of you worshiping with us at home, please take a moment to grab a little olive oil from the kitchen or some lotion from your bathroom cabinet.]

This week is the countdown to Christmas with all the harried preparations to be on or off work, planning time with family, traveling, or whatever you will do.

It will be more difficult to find occasions to step away, to go within, to find the peace that we all need. But you are encouraged to try finding some peaceful time for yourself.

You are also invited to a kind of "anointing" of blessings that only takes a few seconds.

See if you can dare to say, in your own way, a blessing for peace to the people you encounter. It might be "I hope you can find some quiet moments of peace for yourself this week" to the check-out clerk at the store. Or it might be a more formal "peace be upon your soul" to someone who won't look at you funny when you say that to them. Or it could just be a quick peace sign and a joyful "Peace to you!" as you part ways with friends. How will you bestow the blessing of peace on yourself and others this week?

Please stand in body or spirit.

When you see lights twinkle, when you catch a reflection in a mirror, when you notice the sunlight dancing on a surface or a nightlight glowing in the darkness, let these be signs that the Christ Light is revealed again and again in and through this world.

Know that your brilliant presence is pouring more love into a weary world. God loved us by becoming us.

This means you are already reflecting the sacred.
