- All We will use them to reassure those who need to know that they are the recipients of these gifts as well.
- WA The gift of hope is an essential survival tool because it reminds us that the hard times do not have the last word.

The gift of Christ's peace reminds us that we can have peace even in the midst of non-peaceful situations.

The gift of joy is not the equivalent of happiness, but rather the deep call to delight in the small things.

The gift of love is the clarion call to us as Jesus' disciples. The more love we put into the world, the better the world will be.

The gift of Christ's light is the reassurance that we are never alone.

All We light these candles as a sign that we will be Present with Assurance in the world.

# A Responsive Reading from Isaiah, the 62nd chapter

By the end of the Book of Isaiah, the Hebrew people are out of exile and the author declares with assurance that the people have a "new name" for this new time.

a solemn crown worn by your God.

# A Reading from Galatians, the 4th chapter


Paul's Letter to the Galatians sought to tear down the walls between those of differing traditions, gender roles, and socioeconomic status. Through Jesus, there is proof that they are all children of God, heirs to the gifts of God. The presence of a diversity of people is seen as a gift in itself — God's design. Hear this excerpt:

When the designated time had come, God sent forth the Christ — born of a woman, born under the Law — to deliver from the Law those who were subjected to it, so that we might receive our status as adopted heirs. The proof that you are children of God is the fact that God has sent forth into our hearts the Spirit of the Child who calls out "Abba!" You are no longer slaves, but descendants! And if you are descendants, you are also heirs, by God's design.

# Gospel Reading

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 2<sup>nd</sup> chapter.

#### All Glory to you, O Lord.

Luke's gospel account of the life of Jesus also includes the story of the presentation of Jesus in the Temple, a part of every Jewish family's rituals regarding a first-born heir. There were people present who recognized him not just as an heir to the household of his earthly father's household that came from the lineage of David, but also his extra-ordinary lineage as the Messiah they were waiting to see.

When the day came for them to be purified, as laid down by the Law of Moses, the couple took Jesus up to Jerusalem and presented him to God. For it's written in the Law of our God, "Every firstborn heir is to be consecrated to God." They likewise came to offer in sacrifice "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons," in accord with the dictate of the Law of our God.

Now there lived in Jerusalem a man named Simeon. He was devout and just, anticipating the consolation of Israel, and he was filled with the Holy Spirit. She had revealed to Simeon that he wouldn't see death until he had seen the Messiah of God. Prompted by her, Simeon came to the Temple; and when the parents brought in the child to perform the customary rituals of the Law, he took the child in his arms and praised God, saying, "Now, O God, you can dismiss your servant in peace, just as you promised; because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the peoples to see — a light of revelation to the Gentiles and the glory of your people Israel." As the child's mother and father stood there marveling at the things that were being said, Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, the mother, "This child is destined to be the downfall and the rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that is rejected, so that the secret thoughts of many may be laid bare. And a sword will pierce your heart as well."

There was a woman named Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher, who was also a prophet. She had lived a long life, seven years with her husband, and then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the Temple, worshiping day and night, fasting and praying. Coming up at that moment, she gave thanks to God and talked about the child to all who

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anticipated the deliverance of Jerusalem. When the couple had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the Law of God, they returned to Galilee and their own town of Nazareth. The child grew in size and strength. He was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was with him.



In our continued physical distancing out of love for the health of one another, we will share the Peace of our risen Lord by "speaking" that Peace through sign language.




