Introduction

Hear the call to dine with Jesus — an invitation that means much more than a simple eating experience. It never was simply about eating with Jesus.

The table was the place where he fed people, and also challenged them to acts of hospitality that reflect God's way. When we say "yes" to the place at Christ's table, we accept a way of life that embraces God's definition of love, peace, grace, and joy.

The Table of Peace


P This morning we contemplate together what it means

to come to a "table of peace."

The table of peace can take most any shape. Shape is much less important than what takes place around the table. People meet around tables to negotiate the terms of a contract, a settlement, and even a ceasefire and the end of a war.

For Jesus, peacemaking often took place in the act of sharing a meal with people others would have considered "outsiders." We like to imagine that Jesus was always in perfect harmony with everyone gathered with him at the table. Do you suppose it is possible that sometimes even Jesus held his breath when he brought people with opposing viewpoints together?

Today, we come to the Table of Peace. Here we will practice patience and compassion – even when we disagree.



P We gather today to listen, to learn, and to love.

All We are ready to share and to hear what others have to say.

P Though we are all different, we yearn to find a mutual understanding.

All We are standing on common ground.

- *P* We take our seat at the Table of Peace.
- All We know that God is already here!

- WA Where we have colluded with unjust laws, and been insensitive to suffering and fear, forgive us, God.
- All Forgive us God.
- P If we have left it to others to offer hospitality and made excuses to ourselves for inaction, forgive us, God.
- All Forgive us God.
- WA Where we have remained ignorant of different customs and assumed that all should observe ours, forgive us, God.

All May God forgive us, Christ renew us, and the Spirit enable us to grow in love.

- *P* God says: 'Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;
 I have called you by name, + you are mine.'
- All In the name of Jesus, we are forgiven! Amen.

A Reading from Romans, the 14th chapter

This Christian community has significant struggles with diversity. Here Paul helps us understand that despite different practices in worship and personal piety, we do not judge one another. All Christians belong to the Lord Jesus Christ who died for all of us and will judge each of us.

¹Welcome those who are weak in faith, but not for the purpose of quarreling over opinions. ²Some believe in eating anything, while the weak eat only vegetables. ³Those who eat must not despise those who abstain, and those who abstain must not pass judgment on those who eat; for God has welcomed them. ⁴Who are you to pass judgment on servants of another? It is before their own lord that they stand or fall. And they will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

⁵Some judge one day to be better than another, while others judge all days to be alike. Let all be fully convinced in their own minds. ⁶Those who observe the day, observe it in honor of the Lord. Also those who eat, eat in honor of the Lord, since they give thanks to God; while those who abstain, abstain in honor of the Lord and give thanks to God.

⁷We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. ⁸If we live, we

live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. ⁹For to this end Christ died and lived again, so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

¹⁰Why do you pass judgment on your brother or sister? Or you, why do you despise your brother or sister? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God. ¹¹For it is written,

"As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me,


and every tongue shall give praise to God."

¹²So then, each of us will be accountable to God.

- *P* The Holy Gospel according to St. Mathew, the 18th chapter.

When Peter asks about the limits of forgiveness, Jesus responds with a parable that suggests human forgiveness should mirror the unlimited mercy of God.

²¹Peter came and said to [Jesus], "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" ²²Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.

²³"For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. ²⁴When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him; ²⁵and, as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, and payment to be made. ²⁶So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' ²⁷And out of pity for him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. ²⁸But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow slaves who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat, he said, 'Pay what you owe.' ²⁹Then his fellow slave fell down and pleaded with him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' ³⁰But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he would pay the debt. ³¹When his fellow slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. ³²Then his lord summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. ³³Should you not have had mercy on your fellow slave, as I had mercy on you?' ³⁴And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he would pay his entire debt. ³⁵So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart."



because we need each other — all of us — to survive.


