Introduction


We are so often focused on the destination in our travels. "Where are you going?" is the most common question

upon hearing that someone is heading out of town. While the destination is perhaps the impetus for deciding to "go," it is often the journey itself that offers the most memorable moments—frustrating or delightful. This Advent season, we will pay attention not just to the destination of Christmas, but also to the places where events occurred that led to a starry night on which a child was born who would change the world. And we will ponder our own milestones—the progress and the potholes "on the way."

Rome: A Place of Longing

- G We begin our Advent journey toward Bethlehem and the manger with a decree from Rome. Needing more money to build the Roman Empire, Caesar Augustus demands a census so that all who lived under his reign could "contribute" to his expansion of power.
- P Our lives and stories are often shaped by that which is out of our immediate control. This was true in the moment of the Roman decree that would turn into the story of hope for the world. On this first week of Advent, we ask ourselves whether we are placing our hope in the empires of the world, or in the liberating through-line of God's presence. What are we longing for this Advent, and how does it call us to act with hope?
 - I O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! I A Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by. Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light; the hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.







- *P* Holy and Living God, we pray for the renewal of our world.
- All Too often, we let fear or complacency prevent us from calling out the injustices of our time.
 Give us courage for action, even in the midst of our longing. Call us to a "census of hope."

All Call us to our senses

so that we may see, hear, know,

the power of your presence with us, Emmanuel.

We pray this in the name of your Son,

Jesus, the Christ, the Hope of Our Lives.

P God is with us every step of our way toward the Hope of Bethlehem.Jesus is being born into our lives even now.

A Reading from Romans, the 8th chapter

For Paul, true spirituality means that we experience the reality of the Spirit, which enables us to pray as God's children, keeps us in solidarity with creation, and gives us unseen hope that God will liberate us and creation from bondage to death and decay.

I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God, for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its enslavement to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning together as it suffers together the pains of labor, and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope, for who hopes for what one already sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.





I believe in the Holy Spirit,


the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.


P Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.




